Mariann Yeager serves as CEO for The Sequoia Project, a nonprofit focused on advancing secure, interoperable nationwide health data sharing in the US. The Sequoia Project serves as a steward of independently-governed health IT interoperability initiatives, including the eHealth Exchange, Carequality, and the Radiological Society of North America's Image Share Validation Program.

Under Ms. Yeager's leadership, the eHealth Exchange has more than quadrupled connectivity, making it not only the first, but the largest public-private health data sharing network in the US. She also led the successful launch of Carequality which is now interconnecting data sharing networks. Today, more than 600,000 physicians are enabled to share health information across 35,000 clinics and 1,250 hospitals via the framework.

Prior to her tenure at The Sequoia Project, she worked with the Department of Health and Human Services' Office of National Coordinator for five years on nationwide health information network initiatives. She led the launch and operation of the first ambulatory and inpatient electronic health record certification program.
